

Some Facts About Alcoholics Anonymous:

- AA has an estimated worldwide membership of over two million people and can be found in 180 nations.
- AA was founded in 1935 in Akron, Ohio by stockbroker William Wilson and a proctologist named Dr. Robert Smith. By 1939, AA had expanded to 100 sober members. By 1950, AA had expanded to 100,000.
- AA's headquarters (General Service Office) are in New York, New York.
- The AA Big Book has been translated into 70 languages, with more translations in progress.
- AA is entirely supported and organized by its own members.
- In 2011, Time magazine named the Big Book one of the most influential English language books.
- The AA Big Book is one of the best-selling books of all time, having sold over 30 million copies to date.
- In 2012, the Library of Congress designated the Big Book one of the "88 Books that Shaped America."
- The 25-millionth copy of the AA Big Book was presented to Jill Brown, the warden of San Quentin State Prison to commemorate the first prison meeting taking place at San Quentin in 1941.
- The 30-millionth copy of the AA Big Book was presented to the American Medical Association in 2010 which declared alcoholism an illness in 1956.
- The aa.org website gets millions of hits a day and posts literature in English, French, and Spanish.
